Superintendent of Schools Sought

The Caswell County Board of Education is seeking a superintendent to lead the school system as it continues its pursuit of excellence. Candidates must meet the legal requirements to be licensed as a superintendent in North Carolina or be qualified to serve under the State Board of Education's alternative guidelines. Central office and building-level experience are preferred. A doctorate degree or progress toward a doctorate degree is preferred but not required. A successful candidate will be required to live in Caswell County. Selected candidate will be paid on State salary schedule with local supplement negotiable. Applications are due by December 15, 2023.

A successful candidate must demonstrate ability and success in (1) visionary educational leadership; (2) curriculum and instruction; (3) goal setting and monitoring achievement; (4) fostering community and/or intergovernmental partnerships; (5) administration and organization of short-term and long-term strategic planning, budgeting, and personnel and facility management; (6) strong communication and effective team-building; (7) procuring additional funding; (8) visibility and involvement in community activities; (9) leadership in maintaining safe and orderly school environments; (10) planning and funding of school facilities; (11) decision making, delegation and follow-through; and (12) strong financial background in budget development.

The Caswell County Board of Education consists of seven members elected to four-year terms. The school system includes six schools and serves approximately 2,200 students in prekindergarten through twelfth grade. There are four elementary schools situated throughout the county, one middle, and one high school located in Yanceyville, the county seat of Caswell County. Caswell County Schools has 420 employees and total overall budgets in excess of twenty eight million dollars. The school system offers dual enrollment classes with Piedmont Community College which is adjacent to the high school campus. Caswell County is uniquely situated in the northern piedmont of North Carolina, has a population of about 23,700, and is only 45 minutes from Greensboro and an hour from Raleigh, Chapel Hill and the Research Triangle Park. In this rural area you will find relaxed country living, great outdoor recreation communities with close proximity to Burlington, Chapel Hill, Greensboro, Raleigh, and Danville, Virginia. There are also two major airports within 55 miles. The Dan River flows through Caswell County and plays host to numerous bike and walking trails, water sports and fishing. For the avid huntsman, Caswell County is rich in unspoiled Wildlife Management areas with beautiful rolling hills and streams. Hyco Lake, located on the eastern boundary of Caswell County, consists of 3,780 acres and is available to the public for skiing, fishing and other water sports. Also located in Caswell County are two smaller lakes, Farmer Lake and Roxboro Lake. For the golf enthusiast, Caswell Pines Golf Course is rated as one of the top ten public courses in the Piedmont of North Carolina.
